Every month, Statistics Canada releases data on the Survey of Employment, Payroll and Hours (SEPH). This release includes unadjusted and seasonally adjusted data related to employment, wages and hours worked. The survey's target population is composed of businesses in Canada that have at least one employee and, thus issued at least one payroll deduction remittance during the reference month. Excluded are businesses that are primarily involved in agriculture, fishing and trapping, private household services, religious organizations, international and other extraterritorial public administration and military personnel of defence services. The employment figures presented in the SEPH is an estimate of the <u>number of jobs</u> and should not be interpreted as <u>number of employed persons</u> (as reported in Statistics Canada's Labour Force Survey).

Summary:

- In May 2024, PEI's seasonally adjusted employment (jobs) for non-farm employees was 1.2% higher compared to a year ago, totaling 78,340. The monthly figure represents the highest on record for Prince Edward Island. The year over year growth was driven by large increases in Construction, Manufacturing, Health care and social assistance and Public administration. The national employment figure increased by 1.1% over the same period. Prince Edward Island tied for the fourth highest year over year percentage growth among provinces.
- Average weekly earnings in PEI increased 7.1% (or \$70.76) to \$1,071.16 in May 2024 representing the highest figure on record (dating back to 2001). PEI was exceeded national growth (4.2%) and had the highest year over year percentage growth among provinces.
- <u>Labour Force Survey note regarding employment:</u> According to Labour Force Survey, there were 91,500 persons employed in May 2024, up by 2.7% compared to a year ago. There was a year-over-year increase in full-time employment (+2,900) and a decrease in part-time employment (-400).

- The number of jobs in May 2024 (for non-farm employees) *including* unclassified businesses increased by 962 from May 2023 to 78,340. The number of jobs in May 2024 (for non-farm employees) *excluding* unclassified businesses increased 740 from May 2023 to 76,727 attributed to *gains* in service producing industries (+421) and in goods producing industries (+319).
- There was a year over year losses in Retail trade (-357), Administrative and support, waste management and remediation services (-181) and Accommodation and food services (-253).
- There was year over year gains in Construction (+262), Manufacturing (+221), Wholesale trade (+58), Transportation and warehousing (+9), Information and cultural industries (+1), Finance and insurance (+94), Professional, scientific and technical services (+100), Educational services (+111), Health Care and social assistance (+365), Arts, entertainment and recreation (+11), Other services (except public administration) (+88) and Public Administration (+260).

- The wages in May 2024 (for non-farm employees) increased by \$70.76 up 7.1% from May 2023 to \$1,071.16 There was an increase of \$1.85 in the average weekly earnings related to the goods producing industries and an increase of \$80.76 in the average weekly earnings associated with the service producing industries on a year over year basis.
- In May 2024, there was a year over year gain in average weekly earnings in Construction (\$162.36), Wholesale trade (\$220.33), Retail trade (\$47.66), Transportation and warehousing (\$132.57), Informational and cultural industries (\$290.06), Professional, scientific and technical services (\$92.70), Administrative and support, waste management and remediation services (\$19.89), Educational services (\$109.38), Health care and social assistance (\$49.64), Accommodation and food services (\$57.13), Other services (except public administration Public administration (\$82.23) and Public administration (\$62.15).
- In May 2024, there was a year over year decrease in average weekly earnings in Manufacturing (-\$66.47) and Finance and insurance (-\$80.15)



Unemployed Persons to Vacancy Ratio

There were 1,390 vacancies reported by employers in May 2024- this is 1,580 fewer vacancies than what was reported in May 2023. The May 2024 vacancy rate was 1.9% which was below the national rate (3.1%) and ranked last among provinces.

There were 5.0 unemployed persons per vacancy in May 2024, this is up from May 2023 where the ratio was 2.3.

Note: The job vacancy rate is the number of job vacancies expressed as a percentage of labour demand; that is, all occupied and vacant jobs.

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
Appendix 1 – Employment by Industry Progress Report


Graph interpretation: Annual – Historical perspective: 2019 – 2023


Monthly – Current perspective: 2023 - 2024 (YTD)

Goods-Producing Industries











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
