

Every month, Statistics Canada releases data on the Survey of Employment, Payroll and Hours (SEPH). This release includes unadjusted and seasonally adjusted data related to employment, wages and hours worked. The survey's target population is composed of businesses in Canada that have at least one employee and, thus issued at least one payroll deduction remittance during the reference month. Excluded are businesses that are primarily involved in agriculture, fishing and trapping, private household services, religious organizations, international and other extraterritorial public administration and military personnel of defence services. The employment figures presented in the SEPH is an estimate of the <u>number of jobs</u> and should not be interpreted as <u>number of employed persons</u> (as reported in Statistics Canada's Labour Force Survey).

#### Summary:

- In June 2024, PEI's seasonally adjusted employment (jobs) for non-farm employees was 2.3% higher compared to a year ago, totaling 80,118. The monthly figure represents the highest on record for Prince Edward Island and is the first time the seasonally adjusted figure has exceeded 80,000. The year over year growth was driven by large increases in Manufacturing, Finance and insurance and Health care and social assistance. The national employment figure increased by 0.6% over the same period. Prince Edward Island had the highest year over year percentage growth among provinces.
- Average weekly earnings in PEI increased 6.1% (or \$60.73) to \$1,062.94 in June 2024 representing the fourth highest figure on record (dating back to 2001). PEI exceeded national growth (4.0%) and had the highest year over year percentage growth among provinces.
- <u>Labour Force Survey note regarding employment</u>: According to Labour Force Survey, there were 92,100 persons employed in June 2024, up by 5.7% compared to a year ago. There was a year-over-year increase in full-time employment (+5,400) and a decrease in part-time employment (-400).

- The number of jobs in June 2024 (for non-farm employees) *including* unclassified businesses increased by 1,812 from June 2023 to 80,118. The number of jobs in June 2024 (for non-farm employees) *excluding* unclassified businesses increased 1,562 from June 2023 to 78,454 attributed to *gains* in service producing industries (+1,248) and in goods producing industries (+314).
- There was a year over year losses in Wholesale trade (-94), Retail trade (-456), Information and cultural industries (-18), Administrative and support, waste management and remediation services (-311), Arts, entertainment and recreation (-137), and Accommodation and food services (-499).
- There was year over year gains in Construction (+136), Manufacturing (+308), Transportation and warehousing (+41), Finance and insurance (+145), Professional, scientific and technical services (+82), Educational services (+31), Health Care and social assistance (+477), Other services (except public administration) (+83) and Public Administration (+20).

- The wages in June 2024 (for non-farm employees) increased by \$60.73 up 6.1% from June 2023 to \$1,062.94 There was a decrease of \$16.68 in the average weekly earnings related to the goods producing industries and an increase of \$78.96 in the average weekly earnings associated with the service producing industries on a year over year basis.
- In June 2024, there was a year over year gain in average weekly earnings in Construction (\$142.98), Wholesale trade (\$170.35), Retail trade (\$86.77), Transportation and warehousing (\$90.49), Informational and cultural industries (\$396.17), Finance and insurance (\$9.52), Professional, scientific and technical services (\$251.15), Health care and social assistance (\$43.34), Accommodation and food services (\$43.50), Other services (except public administration Public administration (\$42.84) and Public administration (\$63.22).
- In June 2024, there was a year over year decrease in average weekly earnings in Manufacturing (-\$101.59), Administrative and support, waste management and remediation services (-\$122.89), Educational services (-\$32.51) and Arts, entertainment and recreation (-\$38.79).



#### **Unemployed Persons to Vacancy Ratio**

There were 2,585 vacancies reported by employers in June 2024- this is 1,140 fewer vacancies than what was reported in June 2023. The June 2024 vacancy rate was 3.5% which was above the national rate (3.1%) and ranked third among provinces.

There were 3.1 unemployed persons per vacancy in June 2024, this is up from June 2023 where the ratio was 2.1.

Note: The job vacancy rate is the number of job vacancies expressed as a percentage of labour demand; that is, all occupied and vacant jobs.





### Appendix 1 – Employment by Industry Progress Report




Graph interpretation: Annual – Historical perspective: 2019 – 2023 Monthly – Current perspective: 2023 - 2024 (YTD)
