Every month, Statistics Canada releases Labour Force Survey (LFS) data. The releases include unadjusted and seasonally adjusted data related to the local labour market (labour force, employment and unemployment). The data presented in this report has been adjusted for seasonality. Most estimates associated with the labour market are subject to seasonal influence in which the data experiences regular and predictable changes that recur every calendar year (i.e. due to climate, vacations, holidays, etc.). The employment figures presented in the LFS is an estimate of employed Island residents and should not be interpreted as number of jobs (as reported in Statistics Canada's Survey of Employment, Payroll and Hours).

- The **labour force** totaled 102,400 in October 2024, an increase of 2,100 persons in comparison to the previous month. The labour force was 4.4% higher when compared to October 2023.
- **Employment** totaled 92,100 in October 2024, a decrease of 1,100 persons in comparison to the previous month. Employment levels were 0.2% higher from a year ago. There was a year over year increase in **full-time employment** (+400) and a decrease in **part-time employment** (-200).
- **Unemployment** totaled 10,200 in October 2024, an increase of 3,100 persons from the prior month. There was an increase of 4,000 persons in the number of unemployed persons in comparison to the same period a year ago.
- The **unemployment rate** increased month over month and sits at 10.0%. The rate is 3.7 percentage points higher than it was in October 2023 (6.3%).
- The **participation rate** was 67.2% in October 2024; this represents an increase of 0.2 of a percentage point from a year-over-year perspective. The PEI participation rate is higher than the national average (64.8%) and sits third highest among provinces behind Saskatchewan and Alberta.


Prince Edward Island October 2024

LFS - Progress Report

LFS data is released on a monthly basis. The purpose of this section is to track the progress of key labour market indicators. "Year-to-date" (YTD) compares average values of available months in 2024 to the same in 2023.

The labour force reached a record high in October 2024 with the seasonally adjusted figure exceeding 100,000 persons for the 5th consecutive month. The labour force has 4,600 more persons YTD over the same period last year. On a YTD basis, the participation rate is 0.3 of a percentage point higher than the same period last year and sits at 66.6%.

Employment decreased for the first time in three months and the figure represents the third highest all-time. The full-time employment figure decreased in October 2024, this represents third time in four months where the monthly figure decreased in comparison to the prior month. The YTD increase in employment in 2024 is driven solely by YTD growth in full-time employment.

Prince Edward Island October 2024





Overall, labour force increased, and employment decreased year over year in October 2024. There were 700 more males and 900 fewer females employed in comparison to a year earlier. For full-time employment, females (-600) saw a decrease and males (+500) saw an increase. Part-time employment increased for males (+200) and decreased for females (-300). The unemployment rate for this cohort was 10.8%, up 3.4 percentage points year over year.



Core-age Cohort (25-54 Years)





In October, employment increased for females (+400) and increased for males (+400) in comparison to October 2023. On a FT basis, year over year employment decreased for females (-800) and increased for males (+400). On a PT basis, there was a year over year increase for females (+1,200) while males (-100) saw a decrease. The unemployment rate increased for males (to 13.5%) and increased for females (to 8.6%) on a year over year basis.

There were 69,200 persons employed in the **Services-producing sector** in October 2024, comprising 75.1% of PEI's industrial employment base. There was a year-over-year decrease of 100 persons employed in the service-sector. There was year over year growth in Wholesale/retail trade (+100), Transportation and warehousing (+300), Finance, insurance, real estate, rental and leasing (+300), Business, building and other support services (+400), Health care and social assistance (+200) and Information, culture and recreation (+200). There was a year over year decrease in Professional, technical and scientific services (-100), Educational services (-200), Accommodation and food services (-800) and Other services (except public administration) (-400). There was no change in Public administration in comparison to a year earlier.

There were 22,900 persons employed in the **Goods-producing sector** in October 2024, resulting in an increase of 300 persons employed compared to a year ago. There was a year over year increase in Construction (+1,400) and Manufacturing (+700). There was a year over year decrease in Agriculture (-1,700), Other primary (-100) and Utilities (-100).



The average hourly wage rate across all industries was \$30.27/hr in October 2024, this represents an increase of 6.6% in comparison to the same month a year earlier. On a year to date basis, the average hourly rate is 5.8% higher in 2024 (\$29.36/hr) in comparison to the same period in 2023 (\$27.75/hr).

The wages for the **Services-producing sector** was \$31.27/hr in October 2024, which is 7.9% higher than the wage rate a year earlier. There was year over year wage growth in Wholesale/Retail trade (\$1.69/hr or 7.9%), Transportation and warehousing (\$0.61/hr or 2.4%), Finance, insurance, real estate, rental and leasing (\$2.41/hr or 7.9%), Professional, scientific and technical services (\$1.04/hr or 3.0%), Business, building and other support services (\$8.69/hr or 45.3%), Educational services (\$2.10/hr or 6.1%), Health and social assistance (\$4.60/hr or 15.8%), Accommodation and food services (\$1.46/hr or 7.9%), Other services (except public administration) (\$1.77/hr or 6.5%) and Public administration (\$1.70/hr or 4.4%).

The average hourly wage rate for the **Goods-producing sector** was \$27.12/hr in October 2024, which is 2.0% higher than the wage rate a year earlier. Year over year growth for wages occurred in Agriculture (\$1.54/hr or 7.3%) and Construction (\$0.49/hr or 1.8%).

Nova Scotia


Employment in Nova Scotia increased year-over-year (+2.0%).


