

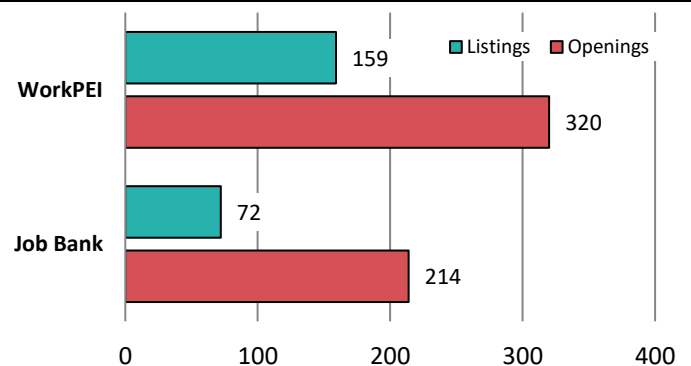
# Job Listings Report

Prince Edward Island- December 2024

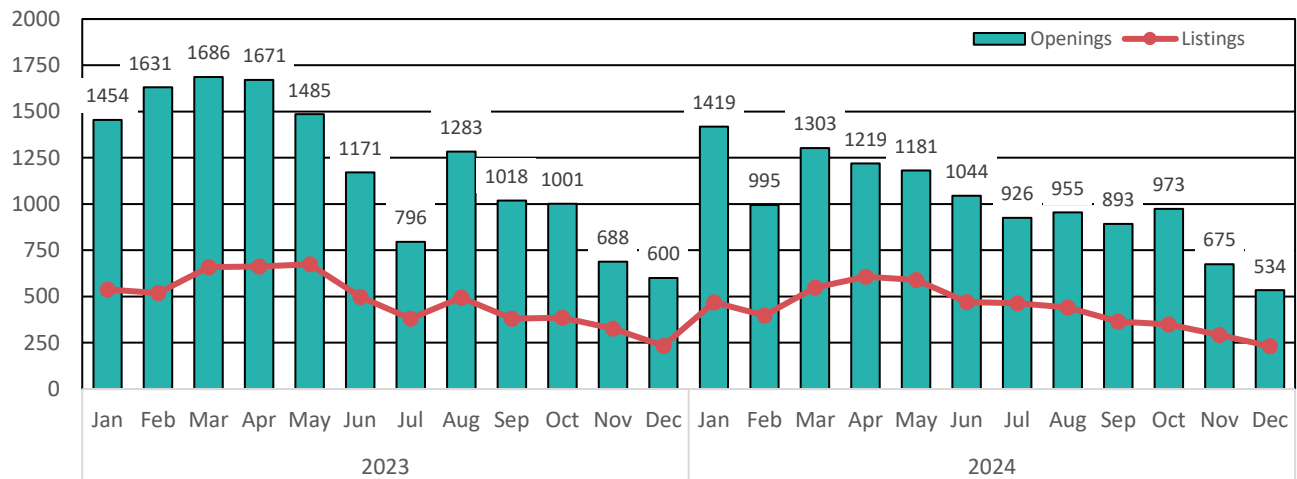
## In December 2024, online job listings show that:

- There were 231 job listings for 534 job openings published in Prince Edward Island.
- 70.4% of job openings were classified as full-time, 6.4% were part-time and 23.2% were part-time leading to full-time.
- 78.7% of all job openings advertised in PEI were for permanent employment while 11.2% were seasonal.
- 27.3% of job openings were related to Trades, transport and equipment operators and related occupations while a further 19.5% of job openings were related to Occupations in education, law and social, community and government services.

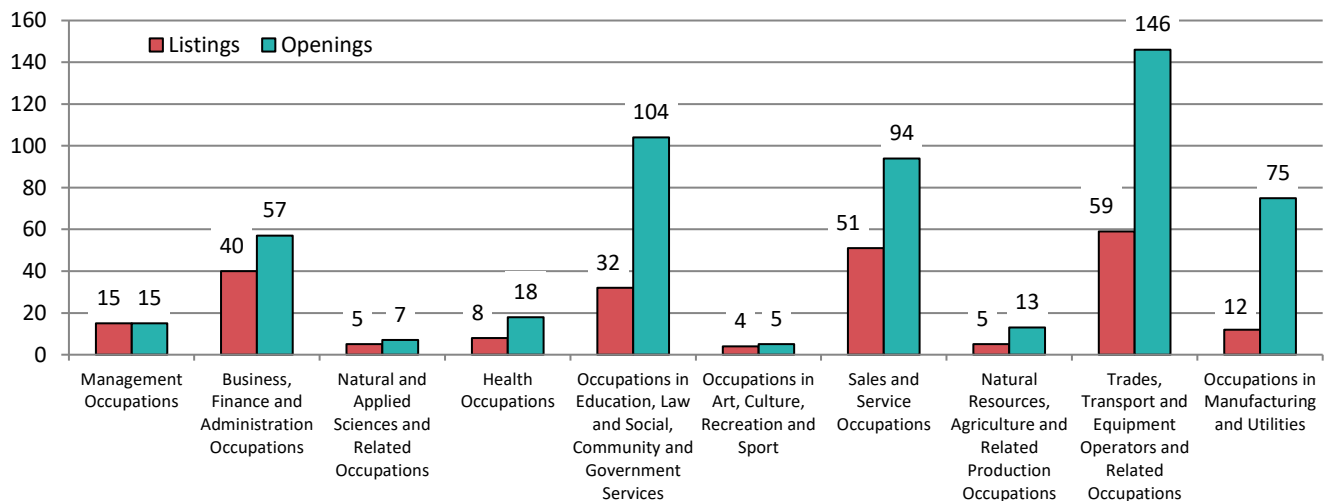
## Job Listings and Job Openings by Source

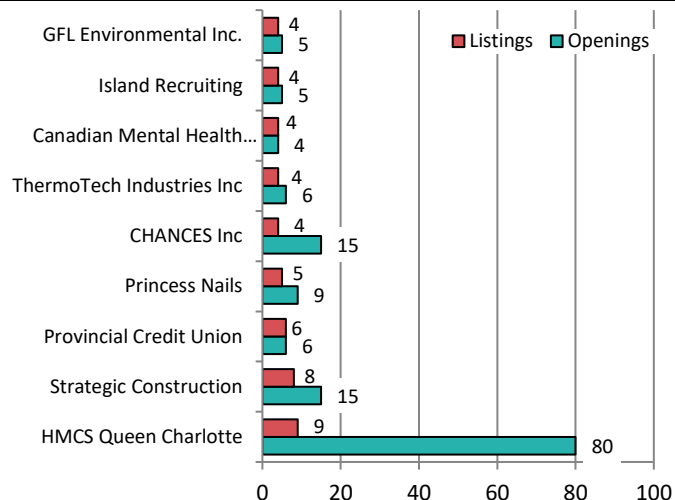

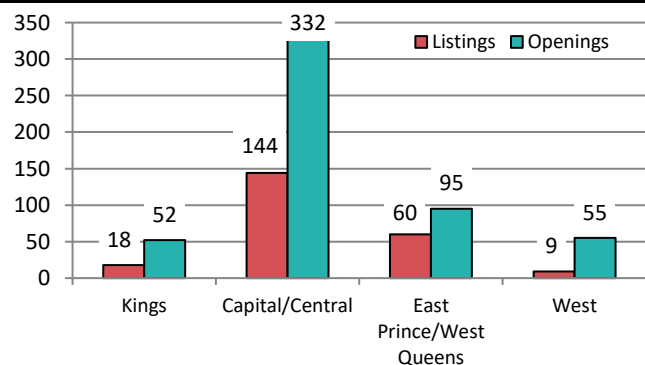

### Terminology and Data Definitions:

**Job Listing** represents an online posting captured on WorkPEI and Job Bank; a job listing may capture multiple job openings.

**Job Opening** represents the total number of vacancies captured in a job listing.

Occupation figures are based on the advertisement's four digit National Occupational Classification (NOC) code associated with the job opening. The numeric values within the four digit determine the Occupational Groupings as well as the Educational and Skill requirements.

The first digit of the NOC code identifies the **Occupational Groupings (or Skill Type)** of an occupation which indicates the broad area of work. The second digit of the NOC code classifies the occupation into four broad **Skill Levels**; Skill Level A= 0 or 1 representing occupations usually requiring university education, Skill Level B= 2 or 3 representing occupations using requiring college education or apprenticeship training, Skill Level C= 4 or 5 representing occupations that generally require completion of some secondary school and some job-specific training, Skill Level D= 6 or 7 representing occupations that usually requires some secondary school, on-the-job training, or instruction that takes place in the work environment. Management occupations which span all occupation grouping are included in Skill Level A
