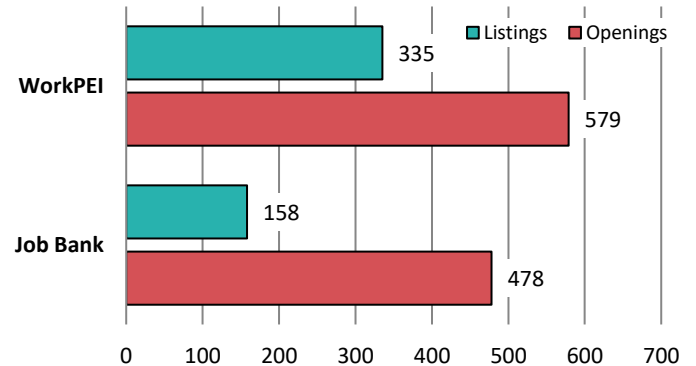

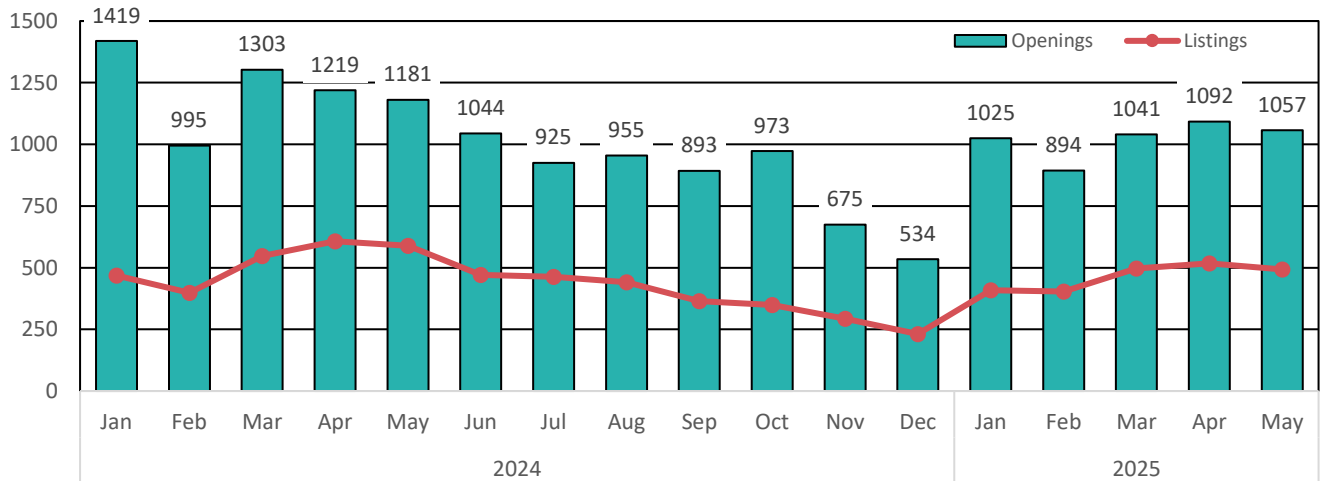
In May 2025, online job listings show that:

- There were 493 job listings for 1,057 job openings published in Prince Edward Island.
- 80.3% of job openings were classified as full-time, 4.6% were part-time and 15.0% were part-time leading to full-time.
- 51.7% of all job openings advertised in PEI were for permanent employment while 39.4% were seasonal.
- 28.9% of job openings were related to Sales and service occupations Trades, transport and equipment operators and related occupations while a further 22.0% of job openings were related to Occupations in manufacturing and utilities.

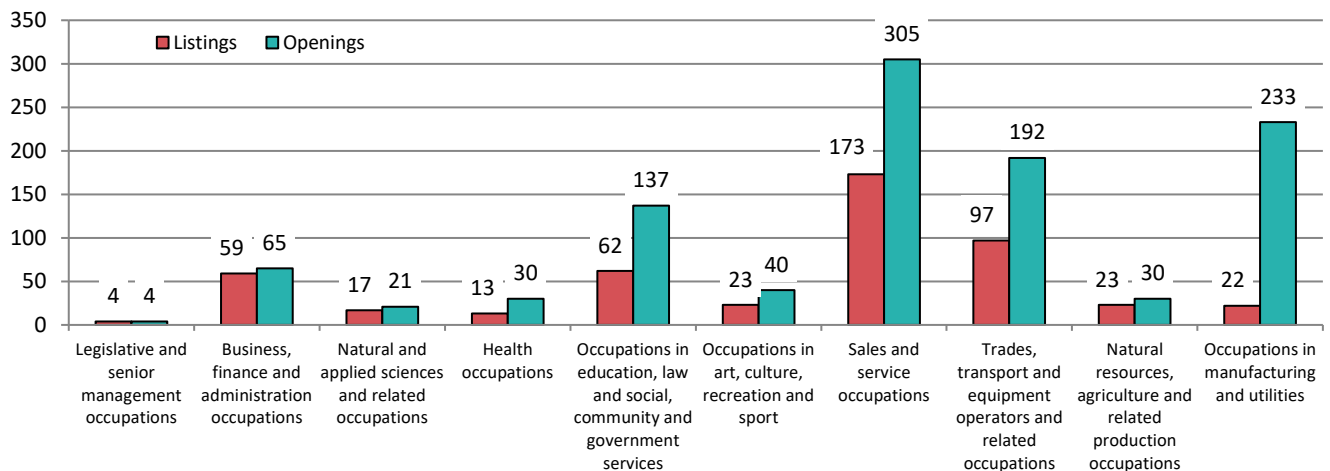
Job Listings and Job Openings by Source

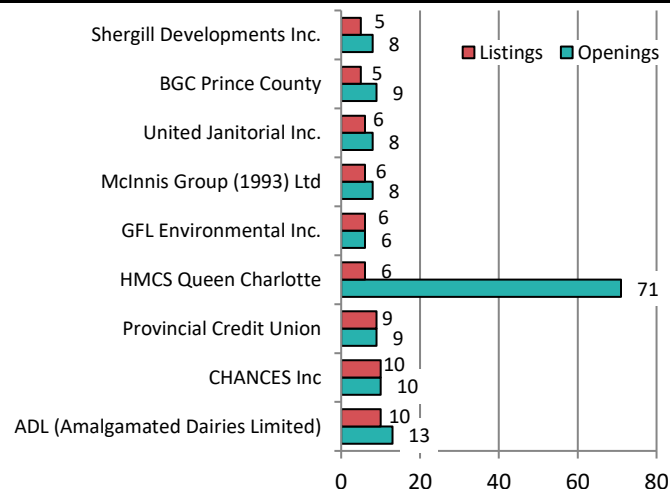

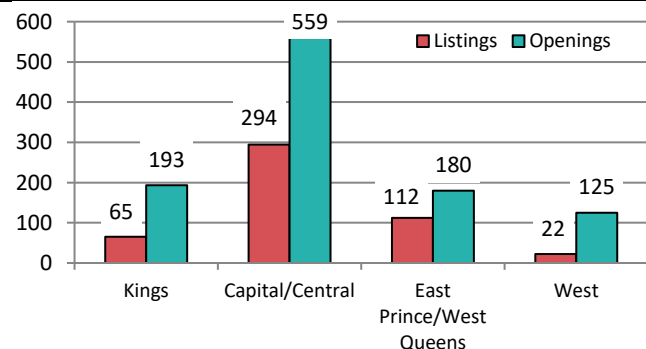

# Job Listings Report

## Prince Edward Island- May 2025

### Terminology and Data Definitions:

**Job Listing** represents an online posting captured on WorkPEI and Job Bank; a job listing may capture multiple job openings.

**Job Opening** represents the total number of vacancies captured in a job listing.

Occupation figures are based on the advertisement's five digit National Occupational Classification (NOC) code associated with the job opening. The numeric values within the five digit determine the Occupational Groupings as well as the Educational and Skill requirements.

The first digit of the NOC code identifies the **Broad Occupational Groupings** of an occupation which indicates the broad area of work. The second digit of the NOC code classifies the occupation into **TEER Categories**; *Teer Category 0= 0* representing occupations which have management responsibilities, *Teer Level 1= 1* representing occupations requiring Completion of a university degree (bachelor's, master's, or doctorate); or Previous experience and expertise in subject matter knowledge from a related occupation found in TEER category 2 (when applicable), *Teer Level 2= 2* representing occupations that require completion of a post-secondary education program of two to three years at community college, institute of technology, or CÉGEP; or Completion of an apprenticeship training program of two to five years; or Occupations with supervisory or significant safety (e.g. police officers and firefighters) responsibilities; or Several years of experience in a related occupation from TEER category 3 (when applicable), *Teer Level 3= 3* representing occupations that requires Completion of a post-secondary education program of less than two years at community college, institute of technology or CÉGEP; or Completion of an apprenticeship training program of less than two years; or More than six months of on-the-job training, training courses or specific work experience with some secondary school education; or Several years of experience in a related occupation from TEER category 4 (when applicable), *Teer Level 4= 4* representing occupations that require Completion of secondary school; or Several weeks of on-the-job training with some secondary school education; or Experience in a related occupation from TEER category 5 (when applicable), *Teer Level 5= 5* representing occupations that requires Short work demonstration and no formal educational requirements.
