Every month, Statistics Canada releases Labour Force Survey (LFS) data. The releases include unadjusted and seasonally adjusted data related to the local labour market (labour force, employment and unemployment). The data presented in this report has been adjusted for seasonality. Most estimates associated with the labour market are subject to seasonal influence in which the data experiences regular and predictable changes that recur every calendar year (i.e. due to climate, vacations, holidays, etc.). The employment figures presented in the LFS is an estimate of employed Island residents and should not be interpreted as number of jobs (as reported in Statistics Canada's Survey of Employment, Payroll and Hours).

- The **labour force** totaled 102,000 in October 2025, a decrease of 1,000 persons in comparison to the previous month. The labour force was 0.5% lower when compared to October 2024.
- **Employment** totaled 93,300 in October 2025, an increase of 400 persons in comparison to the previous month. Employment levels were 1.0% higher than a year ago. There was a year over year increase in **full-time employment** (+1,500) and a year over year decrease in **part-time employment** (-700).
- **Unemployment** totaled 8,700 in October 2025, a decrease of 1,300 persons from the prior month. There was a decrease of 1,400 unemployed persons in comparison to the same period a year ago.
- The **unemployment rate** decreased month over month and sits at 8.5%. The rate is 1.4 percentage points lower than it was in October 2024 (9.9%).
- The **participation rate** was 65.8% in October 2025; this represents a decrease of 1.5 percentage points from a year-over-year perspective. The PEI participation rate is higher than the national average (65.3%) and is fourth highest among provinces behind Alberta, Saskatchewan and Manitoba.


Prince Edward Island October 2025


LFS - Progress Report

LFS data is released on a monthly basis. The purpose of this section is to track the progress of key labour market indicators. "Year-to-date" (YTD) compares average values of available months in 2025 to the same in 2024.

The labour force figure in October 2025 ranks sixth highest all-time. October was the first monthly decline in the past five months. The labour force has 1,600 more persons YTD over the same period last year. On a YTD basis, the participation rate is lower in comparison to the same period last year and sits at 66.0%.

Employment rebounded in October after a decline in September; the figure ranks sixth highest all-time and is 1,300 fewer persons compared to the all-time high established in December 2024 (94,600). The year over year increase in full-time employment accounted for the entire employment increase in October.

On a YTD basis, the number of unemployed persons in 2025 is 500 persons higher than the same period in 2024.





In October, there were 800 more females employed and 1,300 fewer males employed in comparison to a year earlier. For full-time employment, females (+900) saw an increase and males (-1,200) saw a decrease. Part-time employment decreased for males (-100) and decreased for females (-100). The unemployment rate for this cohort was 16.0%, up 4.2 percentage points year over year.


In October, employment increased for females (+1,100) and for males (+1,700) in comparison to October 2024. On a FT basis, year over year employment increased for females (+1,900) and increased for males (+1,000). On a PT basis, there was a year over year increase for males (+600) and a year over year decrease for females (-800). The unemployment rate decreased for males (to 7.5%) and decreased for females (to 5.4%) on a year over year basis.

There were 70,300 persons employed in the **Services-producing sector** in October 2025, comprising 75.3% of PEI's industrial employment base. There was a year-over-year increase of 1,400 persons employed in the service sector. There was year over year growth in Wholesale/retail trade (+300), Finance, insurance, real estate, rental and leasing (+100), Professional, technical and scientific services (+1,200), Business, building and other support services (+400), Health care and social assistance (+1,300), and Accommodation and food services (+800). There was a year over year decrease in Transportation and warehousing (-1,200), Educational services (-200), Information, culture and recreation (-500), Other services (except public administration) (-600) and Public administration (-100).

There were 23,000 persons employed in the **Goods-producing sector** in October 2025, resulting in a decrease of 500 persons employed compared to a year ago. There was a year over year increase in Manufacturing (+700). There was a year over year decrease in Agriculture (-800), Other primary (-200) and Construction (-200). There was no change in employment for Utilities in a year over year comparison.



The average hourly wage rate across all industries was \$30.96/hr in October 2025, this represents an increase of 2.2% in comparison to the same month a year earlier. On a year to date basis, the average hourly rate is 1.3% higher in 2025 (\$29.85/hr) in comparison to the same period in 2024 (\$29.46/hr).

The wages for the **Services-producing sector** was \$31.80/hr in October 2025, which is 1.7% higher than the wage rate a year earlier. There was year over year wage growth in Wholesale and retail trade (\$0.62/hr or 2.7%), Transportation and warehousing (\$1.83/hr or 6.9%), Finance, insurance, real estate, rental and leasing (\$3.06/hr or 9.2%), Professional, scientific and technical services (\$1.92/hr or 5.4%), Health and social assistance (\$0.92/hr or 2.7%) and Public Administration (\$0.87/hr or 2.2%).

The average hourly wage rate for the **Goods-producing sector** was \$28.05/hr in October 2025, which is 3.1% higher than the wage rate a year earlier. Year over year growth for wages occurred in Other primary (\$4.85/hr or 18.8%), Utilities (\$6.82/hr or 21.3%) and Construction (\$1.15/hr or 4.1%).

On a year over year basis, the unemployment rate increased 0.4 of a percentage point and sits at 6.7%.




