Every month, Statistics Canada releases Labour Force Survey (LFS) data. The releases include unadjusted and seasonally adjusted data related to the local labour market (labour force, employment and unemployment). The data presented in this report has been adjusted for seasonality. Most estimates associated with the labour market are subject to seasonal influence in which the data experiences regular and predictable changes that recur every calendar year (i.e. due to climate, vacations, holidays, etc.). The employment figures presented in the LFS is an estimate of employed Island residents and should not be interpreted as number of jobs (as reported in Statistics Canada's Survey of Employment, Payroll and Hours).

- The **labour force** totaled 103,700 in February 2026, an increase of 300 persons in comparison to the previous month. The labour force was 2.1% higher when compared to February 2025.
- **Employment** totaled 96,200 in February 2026, an increase of 700 persons in comparison to the previous month. Employment levels were 2.8% higher than a year ago. There was a year over year increase in **full-time employment** (+700) and a year over year increase in **part-time employment** (+1,800).
- **Unemployment** totaled 7,500 in February 2026, a decrease of 400 persons from the prior month. There was a decrease of 500 unemployed persons in comparison to the same period a year ago.
- The **unemployment rate** decreased month over month and sits at 7.2%. The rate is 0.7 of a percentage point lower than it was in February 2025 (7.9%).
- The **participation rate** was 66.6% in February 2026; this represents an increase of 0.1 of a percentage point from a year-over-year perspective. The PEI participation rate is higher than the national average (64.9%) and is third highest among provinces behind Alberta and Saskatchewan.

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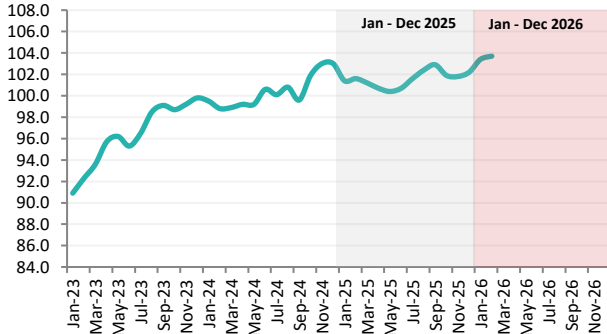


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LFS - Progress Report

LFS data is released on a monthly basis. The purpose of this section is to track the progress of key labour market indicators. "Year-to-date" (YTD) compares average values of available months in 2026 to the same in 2025.

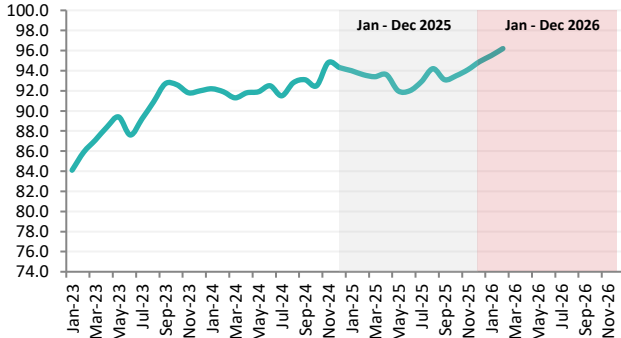

The labour force figure for February 2026 ranks highest all-time- the second consecutive month a new all-time high was established. It also marked the third consecutive monthly increase. The labour force has 2,100 more persons YTD over the same period last year. On a YTD basis, the participation rate is higher in comparison to the same period last year and sits at 66.6%.

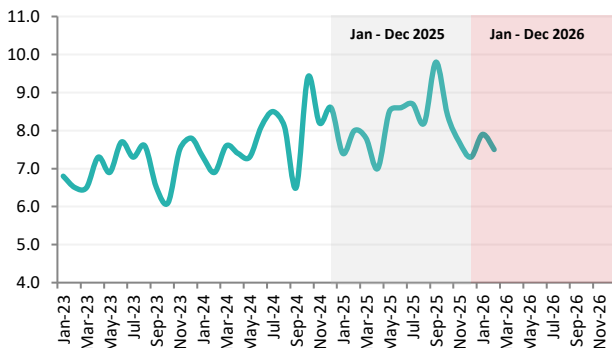

Employment saw a fifth consecutive monthly increase in February 2026. It is also the fourth consecutive month where a new all-time high was established. The figure for full-time employment was tied for the second highest on record.

In February, both the number of unemployed individuals and the unemployment rate decreased year over year following monthly increases in January. The increase in employment exceeding labour force growth was a contributing factor in the year over year decrease in the unemployment figure. On a year to date basis, the number of unemployment individuals in 2026 is 200 persons lower than the same period in 2025.

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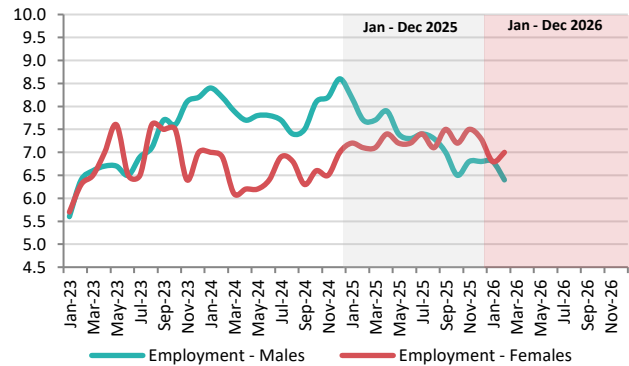

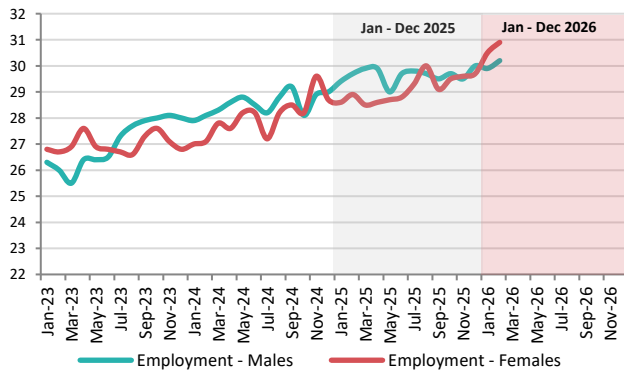
In February, there were 100 fewer females employed and 1,300 fewer males employed in comparison to a year earlier. For full-time employment, females (-100) saw a decrease and males (-1,200) saw a decrease. Part-time employment increased for females (+100) and did not change for males. The unemployment rate for this cohort was 11.8%, up 1.0 percentage point year over year.

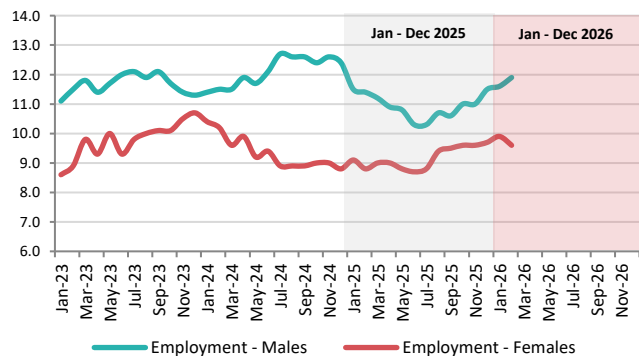
In February, employment increased for females (+2,000) and for males (+500) in comparison to February 2025. On a FT basis, year over year employment increased for females (+1,800) and decreased for males (-500). On a PT basis, there was a year over year increase for females (+200) and increased for males (+1,000) in a year over year comparison. The unemployment rate decreased for males (to 6.2%) and decreased for females (to 4.6%) on a year over year basis.

There were 72,900 persons employed in the **Services-producing sector** in February 2026, comprising 75.8% of PEI's industrial employment base. There was a year-over-year increase of 4,300 persons employed in the service sector. There was year over year growth in Wholesale/retail trade (+200), Finance, insurance, real estate, rental and leasing (+1,100), Professional, technical and scientific services (+1,100), Educational services (+500), Health care and social assistance (+1,300), Information, culture and recreation (+500) and Accommodation and food services (+1,500). There was a year over year decrease in Transportation and warehousing (-400), Business, building and other support services (-900), Other services (except public administration) (-300) and Public administration (-200).

There were 23,300 persons employed in the **Goods-producing sector** in February 2026, resulting in a decrease of 1,700 persons employed compared to a year ago. There was year over year growth Agriculture (+300) and Utilities (+400). There was a year over year decrease in Other primary (-1,000), Construction (-500) and Manufacturing (-900).

The average hourly wage rate across all industries was \$31.78/hr in February 2026, this represents an increase of 6.1% in comparison to the same month a year earlier. On a year to date basis, the average hourly rate is 5.5% higher in 2026 (\$31.69/hr) in comparison to the same period in 2025 (\$30.03/hr).

The wages for the **Services-producing sector** was \$32.41/hr in February 2026, which is 7.2% higher than the wage rate a year earlier. There was year over year wage growth in Wholesale/retail trade (\$1.05/hr or 4.7%), Transportation and warehousing (\$0.38/hr or 1.4%), Finance, insurance, real estate, rental and leasing (\$5.28/hr or 18.5%), Professional, scientific and technical services (\$0.83/hr or 2.3%), Business, building and other support services (\$0.22/hr or 0.8%), Educational services (\$2.12/hr or 5.9%), Health and social assistance (\$3.32/hr or 10.6%), Information, culture and recreation (\$4.51/hr or 18.9%), Accommodation and food services (\$1.35/hr or 7.5%), Other services (except public administration) (\$2.23/hr or 8.5%) and Public Administration (\$2.20/hr or 5.4%).

The average hourly wage rate for the **Goods-producing sector** was \$29.18/hr in February 2026, which is 1.0% higher than the wage rate a year earlier. Year over year growth for wages occurred in Agriculture (\$1.44/hr or 6.3%) and Manufacturing (\$1.23/hr or 4.3%).

Newfoundland and Labrador

NL experienced an increase in employment year-over-year in 2025 (+2.6%).

On year over year basis, the unemployment rate in NL decreased by 1.3 percentage points to 9.2%.

Nova Scotia

Employment in Nova Scotia increased year-over-year (0.4%).

On a year over year basis, the unemployment rate increased 0.4 of a percentage point and sits at 7.1%.
